UNDERSTANDING THE AUSTRALIAN EDUCATION SYSTEM

PRIMARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION

Primary education includes grades 1-6, while secondary education includes grades 7-12. The final years of secondary education prepare students for university entry.

POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

Australia offers a variety of postsecondary options including universities, Technical and Further Education (TAFE) institutions, and vocational education and training (VET) institutions.

DEGREES AND DIPLOMAS

- Bachelor's Degree: Typically takes 3-4 years.
- Master's Degree: Usually 1-2 years.
- Doctoral Degree (PhD): Typically 3-4 years.
- Diplomas and Certificates:
 Offered by TAFE and VET institutions, usually 1-2 years.

RESEARCHING SCHOOLS AND PROGRAMS

IDENTIFYING INTERESTS

- Determine your academic and career goals to narrow down your field of study.
- Choosing a School
- Research universities and institutions that offer strong programs in your area of interest. Look into their rankings, faculty, research facilities, and support services for international students.
- Accreditation
- Ensure the institutions you consider are accredited by the Australian government or relevant accrediting bodies.



APPLICATION PROCESS

REQUIREMENTS

COMMON REQUIREMENTS INCLUDE:

- Academic transcripts
- English language proficiency test scores (e.g., IELTS, TOEFL)
- Letters of recommendation
- Statement of purpose
- Resume/CV





DEADLINES

Check specific application deadlines for each institution and program. They can vary significantly.

APPLICATION FEES

Most institutions charge an application fee, typically ranging from AUD 50 to AUD 100.

FINANCIAL PLANNING AND SCHOLARSHIPS

- **TUITION FEES** Cost: Varies by program and institution; generally AUD 20,000 to AUD 45,000 per year.
- **COST OF LIVING** Expenses: Average AUD 20,000 to AUD 27,000 per year for living expenses.
- SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID
 - University Scholarships: Many universities offer scholarships for international students.
 - Government Scholarships: Australia Awards, Endeavous Scholarships, and Fellowships.
 - Private Scholarships: Offered by various organizations.



VISA AND DEPARTURE FORMALITIES

VISA AND IMMIGRATION

Student Visa (Subclass 500)

- Requirements: Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) from an Australian institution, proof of funds, health insurance, and English proficiency.
- Application Process: Apply online through the Department of Home Affairs.

Working While Studying

• Work Limitations: Up to 20 hours per week during term and full-time during breaks.

Post-Study Work Visa

• Temporary Graduate Visa (Subclass 485): Allows graduates to stay and work in Australia temporarily.

PREPARING FOR DEPARTURE

Health Insurance

 Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC): Mandatory health insurance for international students.

Accommodation

- Options: On-campus, off-campus, homestay, and private rentals.
- Costs: Vary depending on the type and location.

Cultural Adaptation

- Orientation Programs: Participate in university orientation to adapt to the new environment.
- Student Support Services: Utilize services provided by the university for a smoother transition.
